Kathleen Uhl, MD is currently the Director of the Office of Generic Drugs (OGD) in the Center for Drug Evaluation and Research (CDER) at the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). This office is responsible for the review and approval of Abbreviated New Drug Applications (ANDAs) and is largely tasked with implementing the Generic Drug User Fee Amendments (GDUFA). Its mission is to make high quality, affordable medicines available to the American public.

Dr. Uhl joined the FDA in 1998 serving as a medical officer in the Office of Clinical Pharmacology and has served in numerous positions at FDA, including five years as the Assistant Commissioner for Women's Health and Director of FDA's Office of Women's Health and as the Deputy Director of the Office of Medical Policy in CDER.

She received her baccalaureate degree in Chemistry from Temple University, graduating summa cum laude, and her medical degree from the Medical College of Pennsylvania (now Drexel University). She is board certified in Family Medicine and is a Fellow of the American Academy of Family Physicians. She received postgraduate training completing a Medical Research Fellowship at the Walter Reed Army Institute of Research (WRAIR) and a Clinical Pharmacology Fellowship at the Uniformed Services University in Bethesda, MD. Dr. Uhl maintains dual faculty appointments as adjunct professor in Family Medicine and Internal Medicine at the Uniformed Services University. She served as an officer in the US Army and was an investigator in malaria and drug metabolism research at WRAIR. She is a retired officer (Captain) of the US Public Health Service Commissioned Corps.

Dr. Uhl served as a member of the board of directors for the American Society of Clinical Pharmacology and Therapeutics (ASCPT) and served on the Editorial Board for *Clinical Pharmacology and Therapeutics*, *Journal of Women's Health*, and *Archives of Drug Information*. She is the author of several book chapters and over 40 publications in peer-reviewed medical journals. She is a reviewer for several medical journals and has been a member of technical review panels for various government grants and contracts.
