Mallory Trachtenberg is a Program Analyst for the U.S. Department of Labor Women's Bureau, where she focuses on outreach, policy, and stakeholder engagement on issues related to supporting women in the workplace. She was previously with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Office of Refugee Resettlement in Washington DC, where she authored grant announcements, chaired grant competitions, managed national programs to promote labor and sex trafficking victim identification and outreach, and provided emergency placement and care recommendations for unaccompanied and undocumented foreign born children. Prior to this work, she coordinated international refugee family reunification cases for the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees in Geneva, Switzerland, and worked for multiple nonprofit organizations in the refugee resettlement sector. Mallory has a bachelor's degree in international relations and English literature from Washington University in St. Louis, and a masters in social work degree from the University of Pennsylvania, conducting research and programmatic efforts to increase positive health outcomes among women and children experiencing homelessness.
